PUBLIC OPINION ON TAXES FOR SCHOOLS

Since 2013, the Jacksonville Public Education Fund has worked with the Public Opinion Research Lab at the University of North Florida to conduct a scientific, representative poll of Jacksonville residents about their opinion on public schools, including taxes.

This year, the poll included a new question about a small tax increase to support improving school facilities, resources and supplies: 78.5 percent of respondents said they would support a small tax increase for this specific need.

For the last six years, the poll has asked a more general question: "Would you support or oppose a small increase in taxes if those taxes specifically go to **local public education needs?"**
